Year 7 Write the script of a conversation between two or three people who are discussing their leisure time ('Amser Hamdden'). Use the work done in your books last term to help you. Remember to make all characters ask and answer questions and give opinions. Scripts may be written in the **back** of your exercise books or on paper. This is a first draft so don't worry if it's not perfect! Dictionaries can be used or **occasional** words may be pencilled in in English (not the whole script!)
